The summit will discuss national rural trends; provide Delaware specific information about the downstate population and provider workforce. The workshop will also feature the perspectives of local industry leaders in the fields of recruitment and direct service delivery and time will be given for in-depth examination of the disciplines of mental health, primary care, prenatal care, and oral health.
